VACCINE CERTIFICATION: AN ENTENTE BETWEEN CANADA AND THE US WILL BE CHALLENGING

Some officials believe vaccine certification/passports is critical to the addressing any impasse over reopening the land borders between Canada and the United States. But polling data points to ongoing challenges challenges in reaching agreement on any such certification with Americans expressing far more ambiguity about how and where such certification might apply. While Canadians may have some misgivings over whether vaccine passports constitute a rights infringement, the majority believe that they're either still necessary and/or should be required. While Americans may be more reticent than Canadians when it comes vaccine passports for access to various activities they're less so when it comes to international travel where such movement still yields support from the majority of Americans though it is much softer than it is for Canadians. That said, there are sharp differences between vaccinated and non-vaccinated Americans and while such gaps are also apparent amongst Canadians those Canadians that are still unvaccinated are far more supportive of some certification than are non-vaccinated Americans. The coming weeks will be critical in determining how the border issues are resolved and whether an asymmetrical solution to border reopening is unavoidable. The analysis that follows is based on surveys conducted in the month of May 2021 by by Leger in partnership with the Association for Canadian Studies in Canada and with Leger US for the United States with sample sizes and margins of error on the methodology page at the end.

METHODOLOGY

Web survey using computer-assisted Web interviewing (CAWI) technology.

In Canada from May 21 to May 23, 2021 with 1623 Canadians and from May 7 to May 9, 2021 with 1529 Canadians and from May 7 to 9, 2021 with 1003 Americans surveyed via web panel

Using data from the 2016 Census, results were weighted according to gender, age, mother tongue, region, education level and presence of children in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the population.

No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (Web panel in this case). However for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1623 and 1529 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.52%, 19 times out of 20 and 1003 Americans would have a margin of error of ±3.19%, 19 times out of 20

The research results presented here are in full compliance with the CRIC Public Opinion Research Standards and Disclosure Requirements.
