CANADIAN OPINION ON THE CORONA VIRUS – PART 3: ATTITUDES AND BEHAVIOUR(S): IMMIGRANT AND NON-IMMIGRANT

INTRODUCTION

 In response to the Corona Virus/Covid 19 several exceptional measures were introduced by the government of Canada. These measures were a testimony to the increasing seriousness of the virus. Public attitudes and behaviors are an important aspect in managing the national crisis arising from the virus. To examine opinion the Association for Canadian Studies commissioned a detailed survey of the people's views over the week of March 9th which aimed at providing a baseline to monitor evolving views arising from the crisis. Sociodemographic differences are an important characteristic that explain varying reaction and action undertaken. That which follows will contrast immigrant and non-immigrant attitude and behaviour relative to the Corona/Covid 19 virus.



METHODOLOGY

 The survey was commissioned by the Association for Canadian Studies and conducted by the firm Leger Marketing with a sample of 2001 Canadians nationally via web panel during the period March 9-12,2020. The survey sample consisted of 1216 respondents born in Canada, 785 born outside of Canada (119 in the last five years, 84 between 5 and 10 years and 581 10 years or more). The survey was weighted to correspond to the country's demographic profile as reflected in Statistics Canada's census. It has a probabilistic margin of error of 2.5 percent 19 times out of 20.
