CANADIAN OPINION ON THE CORONA VIRUS – PART 4: CHINESE CANADIANS AND THE CORONAVIRUS

INTRODUCTION

In response to the Coronavirus/Covid 19 several exceptional measures were introduced by the government of Canada. These measures were a testimony to the increasing seriousness of the virus. Public attitudes and behaviors are an important aspect in managing the national crisis arising from the virus. To examine opinion the Association for Canadian Studies commissioned a detailed survey of the people's views over the week of March 9th which aimed at providing a baseline to monitor evolving views arising from the crisis. Sociodemographic differences are an important characteristic that explain varying reaction and action undertaken. That which follows will contrast immigrant and non-immigrant attitude and behaviour relative to the Corona/Covid 19 virus.



METHODOLOGY

• The survey was commissioned by the Association for Canadian Studies and conducted by the firm Leger Marketing with a sample of 2001 Canadians nationally via web panel during the period March 9-12,2020. The sample for the custom tabulation you will see below is: Total Canada, 2001 respondents; Caucasian (white), 1575 respondents; and Chinese, 92 respondents.



CHINESE CANADIANS (75%) ARE FAR MORE CONCERNED THAN THOSE WHO ARE NOT VISIBLE MINORITIES (57%) ABOUT A WIDE OUTBREAK OF THE VIRUS
