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#### PROTECTIVE MASKS: TO WEAR THEM OR NOT?

Will most Canadians be wearing masks as we increasingly re-enter the public space across Canada? This is a question that continues to generate conversation.

- While the World Health Organization and Canadian public health officials have staunchly advised against the widespread use of face masks to prevent the spread of COVID-19, other countries have taken the opposite approach by strongly encouraging or even mandating they be worn in public.
- Japan and South Korea, two countries that have been relatively successful in curbing the spread of the coronavirus, distributed face masks to every household. Austria has ordered that everyone must wear a face mask in supermarkets and, more recently, the Czech Republic and Slovakia have imposed mandatory mask-wearing at all times in public.

#### **METHODOLOGY**

The survey was conducted by Leger in partnership with the Association for Canadian Studies with 2015 Canadians, (that included 700 immigrants) 18 years of age or older, was collected via an online panel between April 17 to 19, 2020 and offers comparisons with the survey conducted between April 3-5, 2020

Using data from the 2016 Census, results were weighted according to gender, age, mother tongue, region, education level and presence of children in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the population.

No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (Web panel in this case). However for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1500 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.52%, 19 times out of 20. That 'margin' rises for survey sub groups



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
