

CANADIAN OPINION ON THE CORONAVIRUS – N° 28: BORDERS IN CANADA AND THE USA: TO OPEN OR NOT TO OPEN THAT IS THE QUESTION

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INTRODUCTION

- The Canada-U.S. border is set to reopen on June 21. But this past week's Leger-ACS survey suggests the majority of Canadians are highly reticent to reopen. And while more Americans would be open to doing so by the end of July, opening the border in 10 days does not appear to secure sufficient support from our neighbors to the South.
- Both countries reached an agreement in March to temporarily close the border to non-essential travel — meaning no recreational visits — while keeping it open to commercial traffic and essential workers who cross the border for work.

METHODOLOGY

METHODOLOGY



Web survey using computer-assisted Web interviewing (CAWI) technology.



From June 5th to June 7th, 2020



1,523 Canadians and 1,001 Americans, 18 years of age or older, randomly recruited from LEO's online panel.



Using data from the 2016 Census, results were weighted according to gender, age, mother tongue, region, education level and presence of children in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the population.



No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (Web panel in this case). However for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1,523 respondents would have a margin of error of $\pm 2.51\%$, 19 times out of 20, while a probability sample of 1,001 would have a margin of error of $\pm 3.1\%$, 19 times out of 20.

The research results presented here are in full compliance with the CRIC Public Opinion Research Standards and Disclosure Requirements.
