METHODOLOGY

The survey was conducted via web panel by Leger for the Association for Canadian Studies between October 9-11, 2020 with 1539 Canadians and while no margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample for comparative purposes it would have a margin of error of $\pm 2.5\%$, 19 times out of 20
